1 The Lebanon Special School District has a uniform dress code policy in effect for grades five (5) through  
2 eight (8) at Walter J. Baird Middle School and Castle Heights Upper Elementary Schools. The elementary  
3 schools develop individual dress codes for their grades Pre-kindergarten through four (4) students.

5 The uniform dress policy for Walter J. Baird and Castle Heights Upper Elementary, and their respective  
6 system-provided school transportation, is as follows:

## 7 8 Basic Uniform(s)

- 9 • Solid navy blue, khaki, or hunter green colored bottoms (pants, knee-length walking shorts,  
10 skirts, skorts and jumpers)
- 11 • Solid white, navy blue, or hunter green shirts
  - 12 ○ No blue jeans or denim of any kind
  - 13 ○ No gingkos or pipe style will be allowed
  - 14 ○ Belts will be mandatory for clothing that is designed for belts
  - 15 ○ All shirts must be tucked into pants
  - 16 ○ Tee shirts and pullovers shall not be worn
  - 17 ○ Shirts must have a collar (Henley shirts with buttons and tab collars are permissible)
  - 18 ○ Shirts, sweaters, or sweatshirts must be free of logos\*, writing or symbols
  - 19 ○ *\*Logos less than the size of a quarter will be permitted on shirts. The logo must be of an appropriate*  
20 *nature.*
  - 21 ○ School sponsored and principal approved collared shirts may be worn
- 22 • Clothing shall be within one size of the student's actual size

## 23 24 Accessories

- 25 • Solid white, navy blue, or hunter green sweaters, sweatshirts, vests and coats only
- 26 • No striped or patterned combination of colors permitted

## 27 28 Shoes

- 29 • Any color or style that appropriately accompanies the uniform may be worn to school
- 30 • Loafers, oxfords, and low cut tennis shoes are recommended
- 31 • Socks must be free of logo and trademarks
- 32 • No flip-flops or shoes with thongs between the toes will be permitted

## 33 34 Jackets/Coats

- 35 • Jackets and coats in approved colors without writing or logos are permitted to be worn by  
36 students at any time
- 37 • Jackets and coats that have writing or logos are to be left in the areas specified for personal  
38 belongings

39  
40 The school administration may determine whether the student's attire/appearance is within the limits of  
41 decency and modesty, is supportive of a positive learning climate, and/or promotes a safe school  
42 environment. The principal may allow exceptions for school wide programs or special class activities.
